FUAH

provides support, guidance and assistance to families* and individuals dealing with incidents based on bias; and to the people, organizations and agencies who serve and support them.

FUAH is a nonprofit grassroots organization created by and for families and survivors of hate motivated violence, in collaboration with other individuals and organizations.

FUAH defines hate incidents as violent acts or intimidation committed against a person, group or property that is motivated by an offender's bias. The victim or property has been intentionally selected because of a real or perceived identifiable characteristic or circumstance, or because of an affiliation with people with that characteristic or circumstance.

Although not all are protected by national and state laws yet, bias motivated incidents might include, but are not limited to, incidents based on: race, color, religion, ethnicity, national origin, sexual orientation, gender identity and expression, disability, gender, socio-economic status/ homelessness.

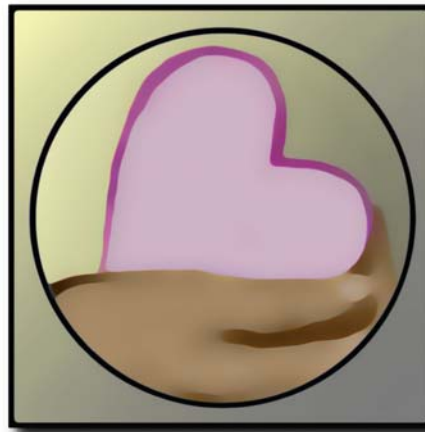
* We define family broadly to include biological, extended and chosen family.

What does FUAH do?

We provide emotional support for victims and their families; help them understand and deal with the legal system, media, and requests from organizations; and connect them to resources. We also support, guide and assist people, organizations and agencies who work with victims and their families.

Some of the people FUAH has supported and worked with:

- the mother of a murdered gay son
- a lesbian couple who were being harassed and shot at by a neighbor relative
- an interracial couple who were being harassed and threatened
- four lesbian college students who were assaulted
- the mother, family, friends and community of a murdered two-spirited youth
- a transgendered young woman and her mom after an assault and during ongoing harassment
- a community after a gay college student was assaulted
- the sister of a murdered gay man
- a community after the murder of transgendered woman
- a gay Arab man after an assault
- the mother and brother of a gay youth who committed suicide
- a community after a lesbian was murdered
- a community after the murder of a transgendered woman
- a father who witnessed a youth who was perceived to be gay being beaten at his daughter's school
- the mother of a murdered transgendered woman
- a gay youth who was beaten and harassed at school and by his family
- a gay man who was assaulted and tortured
- a mother whose lesbian daughter committed suicide
- and others



- the mother of a gay youth who was chased and whose vehicle was beaten while he was inside it
- the mother of a gay youth who was getting hate mail
- the mother of a gay youth who was being harassed
- the mother of a gay son who committed suicide
